MPH Practicum/Internship Experiences with the Allegheny County Health Department

The *Pittsburgh Summer Institute in Applied Public Health* (PSI) provides an enhanced and productive practicum experience at the Allegheny County Health Department. In addition to working to address real public health problems in Allegheny County, participants will experience the day-to-day operations of an active health department while working with experienced public health practitioners. PSI also includes weekly seminars focused on applied public health, as well as opportunities to visit and learn from personnel from other public health program areas (*e.g.,* maternal and child health, infectious disease programs, chronic and behavioral health, housing, air and water quality, food safety, etc.)

Core Experiences Include:

- Completion of a 200 hour / 10 week practicum (flexible schedules are possible)
- Completion and presentation of a project that addresses a specific public health need in Allegheny County
- Attendance at weekly seminars during the first six weeks
- Participation in activities of at least two different ACHD programs
- Participation in at least one inspection activity (*e.g.*, food safety, air quality, housing, water quality)
- Attendance at Board of Health or County Council meetings
