MATERNAL AND CHILD HEALTH

The health of mothers and children are key indicators of general health in any setting. They are the most dependent and least powerful members of any society, and thus in need of greater care and attention than other groups.

We emphasized on addressing issues of malnutrition (obesity and stunting) and the need for vaccinating children. In addition, the scope of e-medicine in all of these areas is also one of our focus points. Attention to the social issues like literacy, violence and abuse, addiction and gender equality were also addressed in order to handle maternal and child health from multiple fronts.
