Aims: The objective of this study is to examine the longitudinal intersections of substance use, sexual risk behavior, stigma, and PrEP use over a period of 3 years among a community-based sample of Black men who have sex with men in the Southern U.S. The specific aims are to: (1) Construct and retain a rolling, virtual longitudinal cohort of Black MSM in the Southern U.S. stratified by recent substance use. (2) Assess longitudinal patterns and relationships between substance use, sexual behavior risk, and PrEP awareness and use among HIV-negative, substance-using Black MSM in the Southern U.S. (3) Qualitatively assess PrEP use decision making and the barriers and facilitators to adherence and ongoing maintenance among substance-using Black MSM to inform intervention development.
